

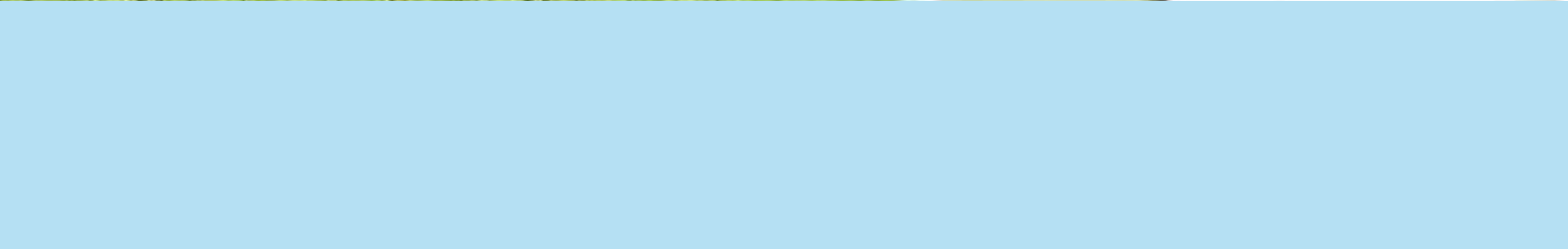

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY FOUNDATION?

Established in 1994, the Community Foundation builds community assets for perpetuity. The Community Foundation is entrusted with substantial amounts of money over time from the contributions of people of significant wealth and modest means. The Community Foundation uses the income from these funds, in the form of grants, to meet the community's charitable needs now and into the future.

Most of the funds at the Community Foundation are endowment funds. An endowment fund is a permanent fund that creates a sustainable flow of grant dollars forever. Through prudent investment, both the body of the endowment and the distribution available for grantmaking increase over time.

The Chester County Community Foundation has three unique features:

local expertise about important projects and programs that are making a significant difference in Chester County

personalized service to donors who want to maximize the impact of their contribution; and

community convener for issues that benefit from partnerships.

With the support of those who care about Chester County, we will continue to grow and enhance the quality of life for all who live and work in Chester County.

This year, the Chester County Community Foundation was called on more than ever before by families who want to give back to the community and make the world a better place, forever.

This year, the Community Foundation awarded \$2,765,106 to the community, via 419 grants and 106 scholarships. Our donors created 27 new funds this year, bringing the total number of funds under the Community Foundation's umbrella to 273. And 2,718 generous donors contributed \$4.6 million, almost twice as much as last year.

Why do individuals, families and community groups increasingly turn to the Community Foundation? In addition to customized, personal service and local expertise, the Community Foundation works with each of its fund donors to:

- ~ focus one's charitable goals, values and mission

The strength of the Chester County Community Foundation is in its power to change peoples' lives. Each year, hundreds of organizations—and thousands of people—are touched through the generosity of our donors.

Our donors establish grantmaking funds at the Community Foundation. The majority of grant decisions are made by the families and individuals whose funds the Community Foundation hold in trust. The Community Foundation also grants a modest amount from its Fund for Chester County, based on decisions made by a volunteer Grants Committee. The typical grant size averages \$3,500.

During FY2008, \$2,765,106 in grants and scholarships were awarded to address needs in our community:

and 106 scholarships totaling \$107,779**

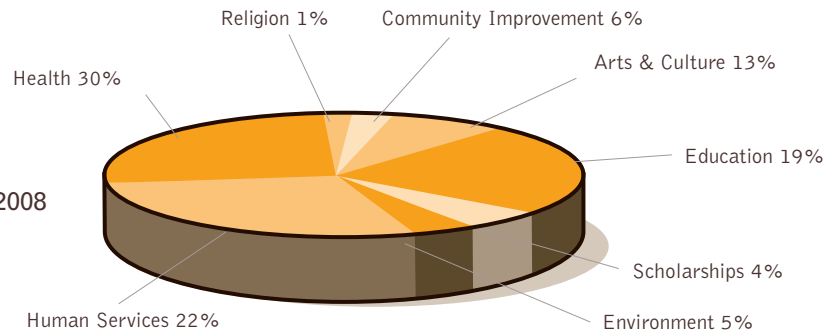

philanthropy awards

The Chester County Community Foundation established “Let Your Legacy Make A Difference Awards” to highlight philanthropic good works and inspire more throughout Chester County. Philanthropy is defined as “active efforts to promote human welfare as manifested in donations of money, property, or work to needy persons or to socially useful purposes.” Legacy philanthropists give of their own time and resources, as well as inspire others to give for the long run.

DR. HENRY A. AND BARBARA M. JORDAN AWARD: Eva L. Verplanck, Ph.D.



The Community Foundation created the Jordan Award in 1999 to honor the philanthropy of Dr. Henry A. and Barbara M. Jordan of Chester Springs. The Jordan Award is bestowed annually to an individual who has made an enduring, long-term impact on a wide array of causes throughout Chester County; and through their leadership has given of their own time and resources, as well as inspired others to give for the long run.

The 2007 Jordan Award winner is Eva L. Verplanck, Ph.D. of Kennett Square. Eva’s commitment to community improvement has deep roots. Eva earned her Ph.D. in organic Chemistry from Yale in 1947, and then obtained positions at Yale the Philadelphia Academy of Natural Sciences.

As Eva ‘settled down’ in the Kennett area to raise her family, she increased her community volunteerism and philanthropy. Due to her detailed, professional nature, Eva became an extremely serious volunteer. She studied nonprofit fundraising, management, and governance in great depth, and she became an astute observer of human nature, team interaction, and group decision-making. Early on she realized the dire need for volunteers to become involved in fundraising, and she became a fundraising advocate and role model.

Eva has served in leadership positions and inspired others to give their time and financial support to a wide array causes. Eva has served on many boards throughout the decades, including the United Ways of Southern Chester County and of Delaware;

Neighborhood Health Agencies; Chester Council of Home Health Agencies; YWCA New Castle County; YWCA of the USA; YWCA of the USA World Service Council; Planned Parenthood of Chester County; Red Clay Valley Association; Kennett Area Park Authority; Quintin E. Primo Lecture Series and Christ Church Christiana Hundred.

In 2000, during her first year of service on the Community Foundation Board, Eva was asked to chair the Development Committee. Her expertise in nonprofit management, governance, and fundraising became quickly apparent, and after her first year of service, she was elected Chair of the Board for a two-year term from 2002-2004. During her tenure as Chair, Eva led with a clear and focused vision. She tenaciously kept the Community Foundation focused on its long-term legacy building mission and increased the number of people who are involved with the Community Foundation. After serving as Chair, she continued to serve on the Board to finish out a six-year term. Eva has been key in cultivating major donors, serving as a stellar ambassador for the Foundation. In recognition of her outstanding service, she was named an Emeritus Board Member in 2006. As an Emeritus Board Member, Eva’s main objective has been to spread the philanthropy story and to tout the Foundation’s role in Chester County.

Clearly, Chester County has benefited from Eva Verplanck’s knowledge, energy, attention to detail, and capable leadership.

Jim Ferrier is a lifelong resident of Chester County who has volunteered with various organizations for several decades. Working with the West Goshen Lions, the Chester County Airport Authority, Valley Forge Trout Unlimited, and the Center on Hearing and Deafness, Jim has dedicated countless hours of time and energy to community issues such as increasing local volunteerism, raising the quality of the air service to the Chester County Airport, improving area cold water streams, and improving the quality of life of those affected by vision and hearing loss.

In each of these organizations, Jim rose to the key leadership role of President or Chair during his tenure. When not in the top role, he was Chair of one or more committees. Jim tenaciously and effectively raises funds; recruits Board members; and mentors board, staff and volunteers.



CORPORATE SOCIAL INVESTMENT AWARD ~ Angelo & Rose Rossi of ANRO

The Corporate Social Investment Award is given to corporate leaders who demonstrate sound principles of business leadership and help the community prosper by consistently supporting local charities. ANRO had its beginnings in the 1950s in

the home of Rose and Angelo Rossi. Since then, ANRO has grown into one of the largest commercial printers in the mid-Atlantic region while keeping the business in Chester County, currently consolidating its operations at a new West Chester site.

Throughout ANRO's expansion, the Rossi's have been dedicated to giving back to the community. They commit both personal and ANRO company resources to support charitable and community organizations including Community Outreach Program; Chester County League of Women Voters; Surrey Services for Seniors; Muscular Dystrophy Association; Valley Forge REACT; Battens Disease; Juvenile Diabetes; National Adoption Center; National Breast Cancer Coalition; Age-Related Macular Degeneration; The Chester County Hero Fund; as well as hospital charities and, local police departments, fire companies, food drives and religious organizations. ANRO has created crime and drug prevention coloring books and distributed more than 10,000 free copies to municipalities throughout the region.

YOUTH PHILANTHROPY AWARD

~ Anne Hawkins



West Chester teenager Anne Hawkins has been instrumental in establishing a public library in the Honduran community of La Entrada with the help of her church, Westminster Presbyterian in West Chester. Anne learned about the plight of the children of La Entrada and decided to make getting books to them her Girl Scout Gold Award Project.

In return for providing over 1,000 books and funding the library for three years, the mayor of La Entrada agreed to provide a building, water, electricity, and

internet service. When the library opened in August 2006, Anne was treated as a local celebrity and was interviewed by television and radio stations.

Now at Hofstra University, Anne plans to continue her fund- and book-raising. "Through my experiences in Honduras, I've learned that money has the power to do good. Even rather modest resources, when spent appropriately, can go very far to make a difference in people's lives," Anne observes.

DOOR OPENER AWARD

~ David M. Frees, III, Esq.



The Door Opener Award is bestowed upon a professional advisor who is an outstanding promoter of legacy philanthropy. By presenting and encouraging philanthropic initiatives, professional advisors play a crucial role in propelling philanthropy.

David M. Frees, III, Esq. is an estate planning attorney, author, internationally known speaker and seminar presenter. A partner of the law firm of Unruh, Turner, Burke & Frees, he has offices in West Chester, Malvern and Phoenixville. As head of the firm's Trust and Estate section, his practice focuses on planned giving, asset protection, and estate and tax planning and administration.

David frequently refers clients to the Community Foundation to establish charitable legacy funds. "I think estate planners and financial managers have an obligation," says David, "to ask the philanthropic question. Simply put: professional advisors need to consistently ask their clients how philanthropy fits into their life plan."

CHESTER COUNTY 2020: *affiliate fund transition*

An Exciting New Chapter for Chester County 2020

Chester County 2020 convenes highly diverse meetings to search for common ground, set community goals, and plan for the future. During 2008, with the support of the Community Foundation Board, CC2020 applied to the IRS for its own tax-exempt status, and received its letter of determination in July 2008. Now a separate legal entity, CC2020 foresees much growth over the coming years.

CC2020 was founded in 1996 as an affiliate fund of the Chester County Community Foundation. CC2020's mission was to support the fulfillment of Landscapes, the County's landmark and award winning comprehensive plan. In 2002, with the County's open space and farmland preservation programs flourishing, CC2020 turned to addressing livable communities as another means of preserving critical natural resources.

Community Conversations are productive dialogues that evolve into solutions and action plans. During 2008, CC2020 convened Community Conversations in Pennsbury Township and Kennett Borough. CC2020's first multi-municipal conversation involved the boroughs of South Coatesville & Modena; followed by The Route One Highway Corridor Conversation, which included six municipalities along the corridor. CC2020's monthly regional conversations at Coatesville City Hall have entered their 4th year, enhancing communication and cooperation among the City and surrounding municipalities. The highest priority issues are multi-municipal cooperation, Coatesville revitalization, and regional transportation.

The Master Planner Program, now in its 5th year, was developed with the PA Planning Association and Penn State Extension Service via PA Municipal Planning Education Institute. Each course qualifies for continuing education unit credits and is attended by municipal officials, planning commissions, zoning hearing boards, citizens, legal professionals, real estate professionals and the corporate community. Completion of three courses in three years is recognized with a Master Planner Certificate. The program is sponsored by CC2020, CCPC, West Chester University's School of Business & Public Affairs and the Department of Geography, and the Chester County Association of Township Officials.

Keep Farming First is scheduled for February 21, 2009 at the Octorara High School campus on Route 41 in the heart of the farmland preservation country. CC2020 partners with Penn State Cooperative Extension-Chester County, Chester County Economic Development Council, and the Chester County Agricultural Development Council on this program.

what legacy will you leave?

The Community Foundation primarily holds endowed funds in trust, and also manages some provisional funds. Endowed Funds are allowed a 5% grant payout for perpetuity, to assure that grant funds are always available to help nonprofits. Quasi-Endowed Funds are allowed a 20% grant payout, which means the principle will be decreased over time. Provisional Funds can be paid out in full at any time. Grants can be awarded to qualifying nonprofit causes throughout the United States.

Legacy philanthropy is much more than sending a check. It ensures your continuing support for causes you care about, in perpetuity. It gives you the opportunity to carry on a family giving legacy. And, combined with careful estate planning, it ensures that your personal resources are used to accomplish your financial and charitable goals.

Gifts to the Community Foundation can be made at any time to provide grants for current community needs and for perpetuity. By establishing a fund with the Community Foundation, you receive:

Permanence: The Community Foundation's trusteeship ensures that your contribution will continually meet needs relevant to your interests.

Commemoration: Your name or the name of a loved one can live on through your fund. If you prefer, you may choose a name that reflects your fund's charitable purpose.

Stewardship: The Foundation's Board of Directors, with guidance from its Investment Committee, staff, and outside investment counsel, closely monitors the performance of professional investment managers. The Foundation makes a full accounting to the community through its annual report, audit, and IRS Form 990.

Grantmaking Expertise: The Community Foundation can expertly assist you in identifying charitable organizations and programs that address your particular interests.

types of funds

There is a \$10,000 minimum to start a new fund. Any amount can be added to existing funds. The Community Foundation works with donors to determine the best methods to achieve their charitable goals. Donors can create various types of funds:

Fund for Chester County

This fund focuses on making grants to Chester County nonprofits in areas of greatest need, as targeted by the Grants Committee of the Foundation. Donations of any size are welcome to this fund at any time.

Field of Interest

Donors who seek to impact a targeted issue area (arts, education, environment, health, human service, religion) or specific geographic region establish Field of Interest Funds. By naming an interest area rather than a specific organization, flexibility exists to meet ever-changing needs.

Donor Advised

An alternative to a private foundation, Donor Advised Funds are popular with donors who wish to establish a Foundation without incurring administrative operating and compliance filing burdens, while capitalizing on the Community Foundation's philanthropy expertise and nonprofit field research. Donor Advised Funds enable individuals, families, community groups, and

businesses to focus their philanthropy and make grants that impact the causes they care about most.

Scholarship

Establishing a Scholarship Fund allows the donor to benefit students pursuing education beyond high school. A donor may name the scholarship's selection committee and the guidelines for candidate selection. Most scholarships at the Community Foundation benefit disadvantaged, promising students from a particular high school, or those who pursue a particular field of study.

Memorial Funds

Donors can quickly and cost-effectively create commemorative funds honoring people they hold dear.

Organizational Endowment and Nonprofit-Designated Funds

Designated Funds are created by nonprofit organizations and individual donors who care about the long-term success of a particular nonprofit charity. This lets donors support specific organizations while the Community Foundation manages investments professionally and monitors for accountability.



Lifetime Gifts

Your charitable interests can be supported during your lifetime—and in perpetuity—through your gift. You will have the satisfaction of seeing your generosity at work as you carry out your charitable objectives.

Future Gifts

The Community Foundation can work with you to articulate your wishes for a gift that would commence after your lifetime. The Community Foundation accepts most planned giving vehicles, including charitable gift annuities, bequests, retirement fund assets and life insurance.

If you decide to leave a planned gift to the Community Foundation, or to a fund at the Community Foundation, please let us know so that we can properly carry out your wishes.

Ways to Give

There are many ways to become part of the Community Foundation and make a lasting contribution to our community:

This is why we have a personal interest in helping youths from disadvantaged backgrounds develop self-esteem, social and leadership skills. The Community Foundation staff saves our family valuable time by identifying local nonprofits consistent with our field of interest and by researching organizations that we identify by other means.

Once we decide on the organizations we'd like to help and the grant amount, the Foundation handles everything. This follow-through includes issuing the Foundation's check from an Anonymous Donor and forwarding us those heart-warming letters from grant recipients, detailing how our gift was used and how it contributed to the organization's mission.

Most of our grant making is done during the year-end holiday season. This heightens our family desire to identify with the needs of others and adds to the holiday spirit. So you see, although we remain anonymous, we still get to enjoy the "warm fuzzies" that all givers experience, but without concern about solicitations for additional gifts that may not be consistent with our current financial situation or goals.

As we look to the future, we will continue to include family philanthropy as a learning tool for our adult children and their families in the years to come. Our goal is to instill a sense of legacy in the next generations, as they are the beneficiaries of the charitable work that is done today. SAMANTHA LEE ZAJAC MEMORIAL FUND, *established 2001*

When a child dies suddenly, families respond in many ways.

Family, friends and neighbors responded to 8 year old Sammy's death with shock and generosity. They sent cards and flowers, attended Sammy's funeral, and made memorial donations.

With the help of a friend, the Zajacs learned about the Chester County Community Foundation, which enabled them to create the Samantha Lee Zajac Memorial Fund.

Denny Zajac explains, "We wanted to commemorate our daughter Sammy's special personality and interests. We also wanted to give the community the opportunity to participate in creating a tribute, to help with the healing process. And we wanted to say

'thank you' for all those who welcomed and supported Sammy during her lifetime."

The Zajacs designated Westtown-Thornbury Elementary School as the initial recipient of proceeds from Sammy's Fund, as it came to be called. They formed a team at the elementary school and developed guidelines for a memorial project that would reflect Sammy's interests and values. Sammy's Place, an outdoor educational center, was dedicated in fall 2002. Nestled into a hillside, Sammy's Place was built with passion and drive. A place for contemplating, learning, questing, exploring, dancing, and singing, Sammy's Place is a wonderful tribute.

At the dedication ceremony, inspirational speaker Pat Croce to set the tone and speakers paid tribute to Sammy's great attitude and enthusiasm. Her oldest sister Lindsay spoke of what it was like to know Sammy, "whose heart was bright, cheery, and large



like the sun.” Lindsay says her sister taught her to “live life to the fullest” and to try her hardest; that “we should laugh with people, not at them, and that we should always enjoy learning new things.”

But this was only a beginning.

Notes Carla Zajac, “Our daughter Sammy loved creative movement and music. She had great rhythm. Music was a very big part of her life. And Sammy loved dancing; it was another channel for her uniqueness.”

The Zajac family begin creating another charitable project—one that would help other children with limitations in how they can move, to benefit from and enjoy dancing. Shining Stars Adapted Dance Camp, a camp for children with mobility limitations, was launched at West Chester University in summer 2007. The second camp was held at Dianne Mathews School of

Dance Arts in summer 2008. Shining Stars is geared towards girls and boys between the ages of 5 and 12 who have physical disabilities. Children using wheelchairs, crutches, walker and braces are welcome. The experienced staff, including professional dance instructors, adapted physical educators, and dance volunteers, creates a great and unique dance experience.

In creating Sammy’s Fund and making grant awards to build Sammy’s Place and establish the Adapted Dance Camp, the Zajac family shows that people can transform grief into a contribution to life. Their projects honor Sammy in ways that remind us that every child brings unique gifts to this world—that each child leaves a legacy.

investment management

The Community Foundation is committed to prudent investment management strategies and fiscal policies that it believes will lead to the long-term growth of endowment fund principal and enable the Community Foundation to successfully meet its spending policy objectives.

The Community Foundation's investment goal is to maximize total return in any combination of its income components (interest and dividends) and capital appreciation while carefully weighing the risks involved. This total return approach provides the fewest constraints on investment managers and, therefore, puts the Community Foundation in a better position to demand superior investment performance results.

The Community Foundation desires a target return that provides portfolio growth, exceeds inflation, covers investment fee expenses, covers the Community Foundation's 1% administrative fee, and covers the annual grant payout of 5% (5% of the previous fiscal year end balance) on an annual basis over a market cycle. In addition, the Foundation seeks to protect the principal value of the originally invested endowment assets, while recognizing that prudent risks must be taken.

The Community Foundation's Investment Committee is comprised of community leaders with extensive investment experience, who volunteer their time and expertise to make sure our funds realize their optimum return. The Investment Committee oversees the performance of four portfolio investment managers.



Hirtle, Callaghan & Co. serves as the Community Foundation's Chief Investment Officer. Hirtle Callaghan, as managing fiduciary, works with the Community Foundation to develop a formal Investment Policy Statement and Investment Plan designed to best meet the Community Foundation's objectives.

Hirtle Callaghan is responsible and accountable for two major objectives. The first is to work with the Community Foundation's Board and Investment Committee to structure a long-term strategic asset allocation plan with asset class targets and operating ranges and to deliver strategic proactive guidance on asset class and portfolio risks. The second mandate is to identify, evaluate, select and monitor and terminate investment managers, manage fund flows and manager allocations on a full-time basis. Hirtle Callaghan will then implement the broadly diversified investment program within the approved stated guidelines through independent specialist money managers. Additionally, Hirtle Callaghan is also responsible for retaining and directing the activities of the custodian, and all other vendors involved in providing data, analysis and other services used to manage the portfolio. Finally, Hirtle Callaghan provides monthly statements and performance reports, net of all fees, on a quarterly basis with comparisons to relevant benchmarks and peer groups.

As a firm, Hirtle Callaghan's first investment objective is to protect principal. Hirtle Callaghan's second investment objective is to significantly out-perform inflation net of all fees. Hirtle Callaghan's third investment objective is to achieve attractive returns relative to appropriate benchmarks and manager peer groups.

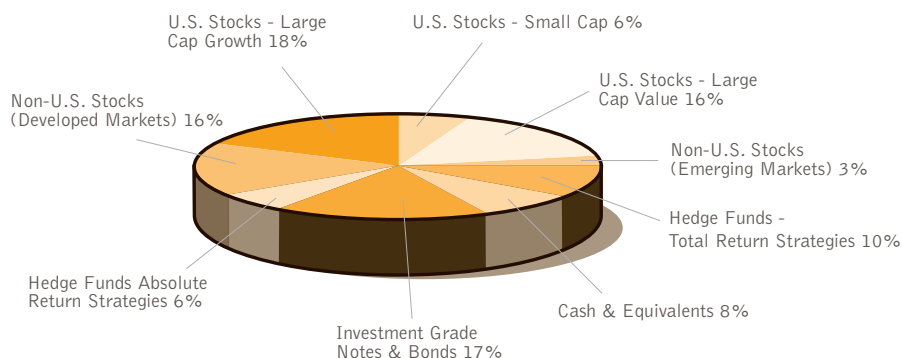

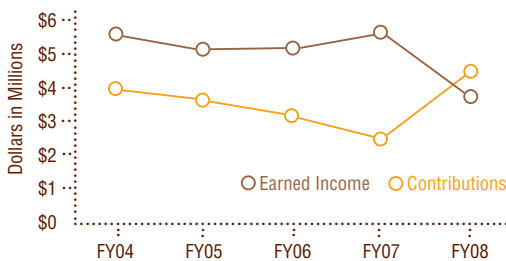

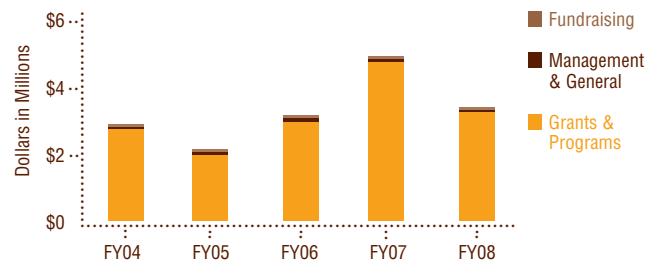
